This is what research says:

- At the core of reading is the bond between children and parents that is enhanced through reading together. It only takes ten minutes a day to build this relationship.
- Evidence suggests children who read for enjoyment every day perform better in reading tests than those who don't
- Develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures.
- Students who read with their parents
 - Are better prepared for school.
 - Begin school with knowledge of book language and familiarity with concepts of print.
 - Understand how books work and have many more exposures to text types and vocabulary.
