Meeting the Needs of Children with Dyslexia- Creating a Dyslexia Friendly Classroom

There are about 10% of children in Australia who are dyslexic and it is also highly probable that a dyslexic child will have at least two other disabilities such as autism, ADHD, dyspraxia, processing impairment etc. Many of these children have a mild ©Dyslexia Assessment and Support Services level of difficulty and with simple changes they can be managed in the mainstream classroom. For those that experience problems at a more severe level, it is critical that the classroom and methodologies are designed to meet their needs.

By implementing these changes you will raise the potential of all pupils, a dyslexic pupil cannot cope without them

Course outline: The course will be practical and will provide ideas, activities and resources that you can use immediately in class.

- How to recognise that a child is dyslexic
- How to gather evidence and informally assess individual pupils in the classroom
- Identifying individual learning styles and creating a multi-sensory environment

How to Recognise and Meet the Needs of Children with Specific Learning Difficulties in Class, in small groups and individually

A training programme for integration assistants.

This programme teaches assistants to recognise and meet the needs of children who are dyslexic and also children with other specific learning difficulties. The programme is intended to help integration/classroom assistants to be able to confidently support the children in class particularly in reading, spelling and maths. To understand more about different cognitive weaknesses that children have, such as: visual discrimination

difficulties or auditory processing weakness. In addition hey will be provided with the tools to meet the needs of these children in class and individually.

There will be practical group work sessions and the assistants will have a chance the try out the resources and use them to put together programmes that they can practice in small group situations or with specific individuals

- To be able to recognise in pupils signs and symptoms of Specific Learning Difficulties including Autism, Dyslexia, ADD/ADHD and Aspergers.
- How to gather evidence and informally assess individual pupils in the classroom
- To develop a range of strategies to support children with special needs in class
- Specific support for reading, writing and maths
- Using ICT to support pupils. Ideas for class work, free resources to download and games and activities
- Developing and using social stories for children with Autism, Aspergers, ADD and general behaviour difficulties
