

# Meeting the Needs of Students with Dyslexia and other LDs- Creating an Inclusive Learning Environment

Addressing the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers (APST) Presented by Karen Starkiss

There are about 10% of students in Australia who are dyslexic and it is also highly probable that a dyslexic student will have at least two other disabilities such as autism, ADHD, dyspraxia, processing impairment etc. Many of these students have a mild level of difficulty and with simple changes they can be managed in the mainstream classroom. For those that experience problems at a more severe level, it is critical that the classroom and methodologies are designed to meet their needs.

*By implementing these changes you will raise the potential of all students, a dyslexic pupil cannot cope without them*

**Workshop outline:** The course will be extremely practical and will provide ideas, activities and resources that you can use immediately in class. Will include hand-outs and resources & many suggestions will be applicable for all students with LD

**Karen Starkiss: Dyslexia Assessments and Support Services.** Karen brings over 30 years of experience as a teacher of primary and secondary students in the UK and therefore knows what to recommend and what is practical. In England, she was Principal of one of the top performing primary schools, despite the fact that she had the highest number of students with severe Learning Difficulties in the County. She has worked in “failing” schools to quickly improve standards of teaching and learning. In 2006 she moved to Australia where she has since established the Dyslexia Assessments and Support Services. Karen has wide experience in assessing dyslexic children, teenagers and adults for learning difficulties and is currently providing accredited in-service professional development to schools regarding creating and implementing dyslexia-friendly schools. Karen has been interviewed by the Age and on ABC radio about her expertise in dyslexia and has advised A Government Task Force in Canberra about supporting children with learning difficulties. Since 2014 she spent some time working with the Education team in the ACT, to put together a program to make all schools, more inclusive and accessible, provided training for Expert and Lead teachers and professional in the ACT to enable them to implement the program in individual schools.
